Subsequently, a two-year Bachelor of Music (Honours) top-up degree was launched in 2011. It was the first time in the RCM's prestigious 130-year history that its degrees were awarded outside the United Kingdom. The RCM-NAFA programme is generously supported by the Singapore government, enabling talented musicians in Singapore to develop and build their careers, to sustain and build on the thriving and growing musical life of Singapore and Southeast Asia.

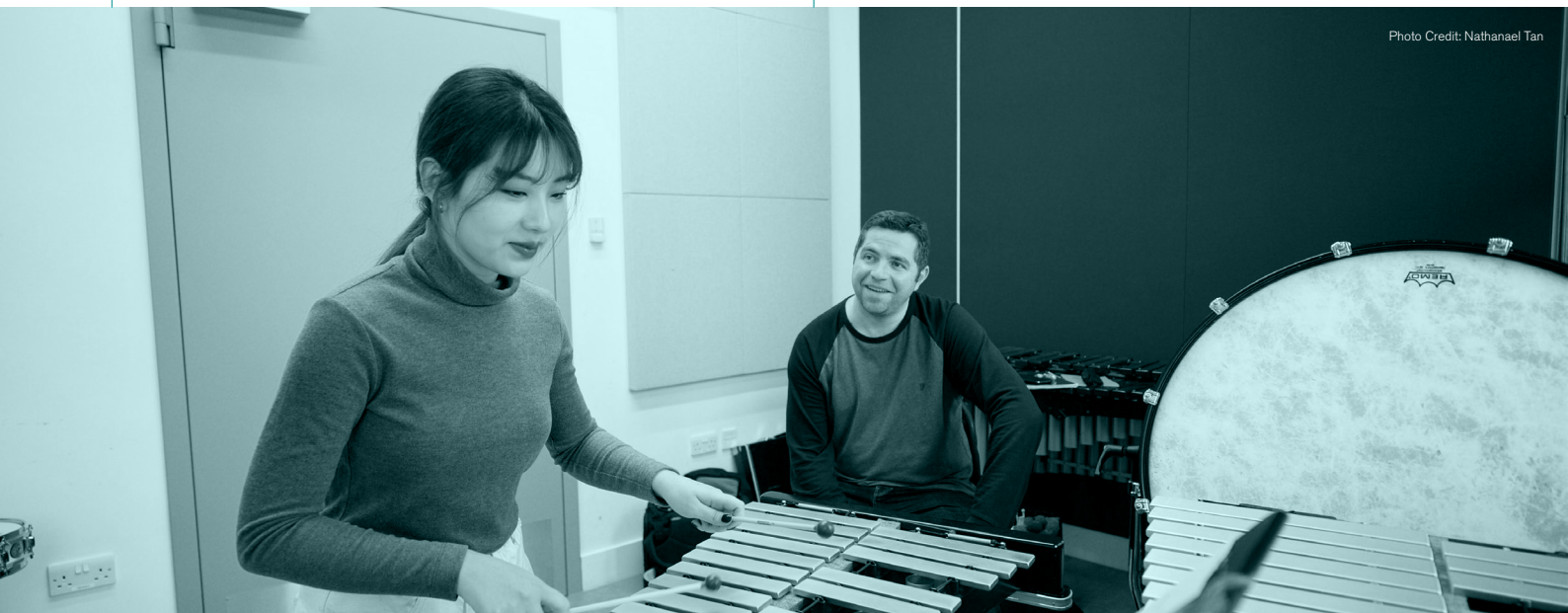
Distinguish Your Teaching Practice

1-on-1 Principal Study Lessons

Develop your technical competencies through 1-on-1 weekly sessions with your principal study lecturer. Expand your breadth of knowledge through performance classes, masterclasses and concerts.

International Placement

Take part in the 7-week international placement at the Royal College of Music in London, where you will experience RCM's state-of-the-art resources and world-leading expertise to develop unique cultural perspectives on music education.

Teaching Practicum

Immerse yourself in the music education industry by applying your knowledge and skills in a teaching environment. Reflect on your teaching aims and outcomes under the guidance of a mentor.

Weekly Teaching Seminars

Broaden your horizons through weekly teaching seminars on repertoire studies. Delve deeper into the socio-historical contexts of musical repertoire, and survey key learning resources to adapt your teaching approaches to a wide range of musical repertoires. Hone your analytical skills and develop instrument-specific teaching approaches to cater to learners' needs.

Elective Modules

Develop and nurture your leadership and applied skills through a range of elective modules, which you can choose based on your interests, needs and inclinations. Learn to apply your knowledge to the fields of study that interest you.

2 EXCITING YEARS

The BEd (Honours) in Instrumental & Vocal Teaching programme is a two-year top-up course offered on a full-time basis. Divided into four semesters of 14 teaching weeks, an average of 40 hours per week is to be committed, including teaching hours and independent study.

Year 1

Acquire technical and interpretative skills and hone your musicality with confidence through performance classes, masterclasses and concerts. Gain exposure into the philosophical, theoretical and sociocultural perspectives in Music Education, and apply these concepts to your professional work in Singapore and the region.

YOUR **STEP BY STEP** ADMISSION GUIDE



First, let's check off these boxes

- I have a relevant Diploma in Music or Diploma in Music Teaching from NAFA or a recognised institution
- I am 19 years of age or older
- I am proficient in English (IELTS Academic Band 5.5 or equivalent)



Next, let's prepare for the auditions

- Submission of a personal statement (250-300 words) on the following questions:
 - Why are you applying for the BEd (Hons) in Instrumental & Vocal Teaching course?
 - What skills do you possess that make you suitable for the rigorous demands of the course?
- The audition should last about 20 minutes. This includes:
 - A programme of your choice for 10-12 minutes
 - A quick-study test
 - An interview and assessment of a range of course work



If you can't make it for a live audition,

- Submit a video recording (please visit our website for complete guidelines). An interview via Zoom will be arranged by the Student Admissions Office should you pass the video screening round. A quick-study test will be conducted during the interview.
